WOOD BADGE NE-IV-219

What is Wood Badge?

Wood Badge is Scouting's advanced adult leadership skills training course. The course focuses on strengthening leadership skills, improving every adult leader's ability to work with groups of youth and adults. Incorporating leadership concepts that are used in corporate America, the course takes place within the constructs of a Scouting unit, living and experiencing the spirit of Scouting.

Among the topics covered are: valuing people, team development, situational leadership, problem solving, managing conflict, listening, and communicating.



Who can attend?

- Volunteers and professionals in Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, and Venturing.
- Wood Badge is intended for adult Scouters in all leadership positions from all branches of Scouting.

Where?

- Camp Twin Echo, New Florence, PA.
- Living arrangements for the first weekend will be provided for you.
- On the second weekend, personal tents and patrol cooking will be required.



When?

- Friday, September 11th at 7:30 AM to Sunday, September 13th at 5:30 PM.

And

- Friday, October 9th at 7:30 AM to Sunday, October 11th at 4:30 PM.
- One patrol meeting between the two weekends - date, time, and place to be determined by your patrol.

Attendance at **both weekends and** the patrol meeting is required.

What does it cost?

- Early-Bird discount fee of \$195 for applications/deposits received by April 15, 2009 (Last Year's Price!).
- Regular fee of \$215 if paid in full by August 1, 2009.
- Late fee of \$20 for accounts not settled by August 1, 2009 .
- A \$50.00 deposit must be sent with the application. (deposit non-refundable after August 1, 2009)
