CONDITIONS FOR USE OF COUNCIL CAMPING PROPERTY

The best rules are the Scout Oath and Law with good common sense. To avoid misunderstanding, the following conditions also prevail. Thank you for your cooperation and have a GREAT CAMPOUT! **Please have the courtesy to call the camp if you cancel your plans within two days of your arrival date.**

- PERMITS:** Will be issued only with the completion of this application. Reservations are confirmed only when a permit number has been issued. All reservations are accepted on a first come basis. In the event of an emergency, the council reserves the right to cancel permit on 24 hours notice. Phone reservations will be held for two weeks only. Camp cannot be responsible for any damage or loss of troop or personal items.
 - ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE:** The unit must check in and out of camp with the camp ranger. Only registered Scouts are admitted. Check-in time must be prior to 10:00 p.m. Check-out time is no later than 5:00 p.m. on day of departure. The group must remain in camp until properly checked out. All vehicles are to be parked in assigned areas only. Roads must be kept open for travel at all times. Camp speed limit is 10 miles per hour. If your arrival will be after 9:00 p.m., call ranger.
 - OFF LIMITS:** All buildings and related grounds are off limits unless authorized by this permit.
 - FIRES:** Request the ranger's instructions on the number and location of fires. Fires must not be built up to dangerous or nuisance proportions and must be tended at all times. Low pressure gasoline stoves and lanterns using kerosene or other fuels are dangerous and prohibited on all council camp properties. Underwriter-approved liquified petroleum (LP) propane or butane lanterns or stoves are permitted only under adult supervision and control. The use of fuels for starting fires is prohibited. We hope you find a supply of wood left by the previous group. Please replenish for the next group. NOTE: Only hard wood (maple, oak, birch, cherry) can be used in indoor fireplaces and stoves. Softwoods (pine, spruce, fir, cedar, poplar) must only be used outside due to the dangers of creosote build up.
 - CAMP ACTIVITY HOURS:** Activities are between 7:00 a.m. and 10:00 p.m. At all other times, please confine your group to the limits of your campsite and be considerate of others. Do not enter other campsites without permission from unit leader.
 - CONSERVATION:** Service projects to improve the environment are encouraged. See your ranger for plans. The Outdoor Code should be in action at all times. Do not remove bark or fell any trees. The use of any tools must be supervised by a unit leader. The ranger may deny the use of any tool wherever their use is deemed unsafe. If any live trees are cut or damaged, the unit will be held responsible for its replacement at a cost of \$10.00 each. Replacement must be arranged with the ranger with planting completed within 6 months.
 - DISPOSAL:** All solid garbage, except cans and bottles, are to be burned. No solid matter is to be buried at any time. What is carried in should always be carried out.
 - SANITATION:** Your unit will be assigned a latrine and is responsible for its proper use. No other method of human waste disposal is permitted. Food preparation or dishwashing is never permitted at or near a latrine washing area. These activities should only be performed in your campsite. Drinking water must only be obtained from certified camp taps and never from springs and streams.
 - ACCIDENTS:** Report all accidents, fires, or property damage to the ranger at once. Observe the location of first aid and fire equipment and be prepared to cooperate with the ranger if requested. Use of physician or hospital is at the expense of the unit requesting such treatment. Transportation of injured person must be arranged by the unit.
 - FIREARMS:** The use of firearms, archery equipment, gas guns, and air guns are prohibited except with approval of the Council Camping Committee.
 - PROHIBITED ON CAMP PROPERTY:** Alcoholic beverages, illegal substances, firearms, fireworks, dogs, cats, other pets, floating devices, bicycles, and activities not consistent with the Scout Oath and Law are not permitted..
 - FISHING:** Where applicable, fishing is permitted except in swimming areas. No live minnows may be used as bait.
 - LEADERSHIP:** All camping trips must be led by a minimum of two adult leaders, one who must be at least 21 years of age with a second leader who must be at least 18 years of age. Pack camping and Webelos Den overnighter events must be under the leadership of trained adults in accordance with National BSA Standards.
 - 10 HR. BEAVER SERVICE PATCH:** Ask a ranger for a tracking card. Hours may be collected from any 5 camps.
- INFRACTIONS:** The Council Executive Board has designated the ranger as authority for dealing with any rule infractions. If immediate safety of others is put in jeopardy, the unit may be expelled at once. For serious or repeated infractions such as not checking out of camp, the council may deny the use of the camps to a unit. If common laws are broken, local police may be notified.
